



Campbell County – Election 2020 What’s on the ballot

KENTUCKY HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

D-67: Includes the cities of Wilder, Dayton, Newport, Bellevue, Southgate, Woodlawn, and a small portion of Highland Heights. Currently represented by Dennis Keene - D.

D-68: Includes the cities of Fort Thomas, Cold Spring, Alexandria, most of Highland Heights, and most of the more rural portions of the county. Currently represented by Joe Fischer – R.

D-69: Includes two precincts in Campbell County, Claryville and Cold Spring D. Currently represented by Kim Moser – R.

CITY GOVERNMENT

The following cities in Campbell County have their own municipal governments. Mayors are elected for 4 years; councilmen/women and commissioners are elected every 2 years. All regular elections for local offices are held in even-numbered years. Councils and commissions will be re-elected in 2020. Only one mayor seat, in Newport, will be on the ballot.

In four cities, a primary will be triggered if the number of candidates filing for council or commission is double the number of seats plus one. All other Campbell County cities have unlimited filing for the general election.

- Newport – 4 seats available, primary if 9 or more file, top 8 move on to general
- Fort Thomas – 6 seats available, primary if 13 or more file, top 12 move on to general
- Bellevue – 6 seats available, primary if 13 or more file, top 12 move on to general

- Dayton – 6 seats available, primary if 13 or more file, top 12 move on to general

SCHOOL BOARDS

Campbell County School District

Five seats; elected in staggered 4-year terms; in 2020 three seats are open in Districts 2, 3 & 5.

Independent Districts

There are 5 independent school districts in Campbell County. School board seats will be open in 2020 for the following:

- Bellevue – 5 members; 2 seats on the ballot
- Dayton – 6 members; 4 seats on the ballot
- Fort Thomas – 5 members; 2 seats on the ballot
- Newport – 5 members; 3 seats on the ballot
- Southgate – 5 members; 2 seats on the ballot (Southgate District includes P-K through grade 8)
